



## REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS

The Law Society of Saskatchewan is occasionally required to appoint a Trustee to manage a practice when a lawyer is suspended, dies, becomes incapacitated or abandons the practice.

The Law Society is accepting applications from lawyers to serve as Trustee for an annual flat yearly fee. As such, there is an element of risk (or an opportunity for a windfall) because the number of trusteeships in a year is unpredictable, as are the size and nature of the practices subject to trusteeship.

The duty of the Trustee is to provide interim protection for the clients and to eventually distribute the files according to the client's instructions. Further information on the duties of the Trustee are outlined in the [Trusteeship Manual](#), however, readers are cautioned that the Manual is currently under review.

The number of Trusteeship Orders in the past is as follows:

2002 - 0	2005 - 1
2003 - 2	2006 - 0
2004 - 1	2007 - 2
