Formal Complaint

I, DONNA SIGMETH, of the City of Regina, in the Province of Saskatchewan, Complaints Counsel for the Law Society of Saskatchewan, do hereby certify that John Will, Vice-Chair of the Discipline Committee of the Benchers of The Law Society of Saskatchewan, has appointed a Hearing Committee pursuant to Section 47(1) of *The Legal Profession Act, 1990*, comprised of William Holliday as Chair, Ronald Kruzeniski Q.C. and Janice Wall to hear and determine a formal complaint set out by the Investigation Committee consisting of Susan Barber and Gregory Walen Q.C., pursuant to Section 46(1) of *The Legal Profession Act, 1990*, against KIM ALAN STINSON, a lawyer and a member of The Law Society of Saskatchewan, carrying on the practice of law at all of the relevant times in the City of Regina, in the Province of Saskatchewan, as follows:

THAT KIM ALAN STINSON, of the City of Regina, in the Province of Saskatchewan:

1. Is guilty of conduct unbecoming a lawyer, in that he provided a written undertaking to the Bank of Nova Scotia that he was not in a position to fulfill;

Reference Chapter IX and XVI of the *Code of Professional Conduct*.

2. Is guilty of conduct unbecoming a lawyer, in that he provided a written undertaking to the Canada Revenue Agency that he was not in a position to fulfill;

Reference Chapter IX and XVI of the *Code of Professional Conduct*.

3. Is guilty of conduct unbecoming a lawyer, in that he misled the Canada Revenue Agency, by providing to them a written undertaking that he was not in a position to fulfill, and in so doing induced them to discontinue enforcement proceedings against his client; and

Reference Chapter I of the *Code of Professional Conduct*.

4. Is guilty of conduct unbecoming a lawyer, in that he failed to honor a written undertaking provided by him to the Canada Revenue Agency on behalf of his client.

Reference Chapter IX and XVI of the *Code of Professional Conduct*.
