



## TRC Workshop: Gladue Reports and FASD Training

The Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada spent six years travelling to all parts of Canada to hear from approximately 7,000 survivors of the residential school system which resulted in the release of the Calls to Action Report in June 2015.

The Calls to Action Report outlines 94 areas that need to be addressed. Call to Action #30 and #31 addresses the overincarceration of Indigenous peoples. Call to Action #33 and #34, outline the issue of Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD).

The Law Society of Saskatchewan recognizes the importance of these Calls to Action and has planned an interactive and informative day exploring both FASD and Gladue. In the morning specialists in the FASD field will discuss FASD, and its relevance to the justice system. In the afternoon, Professor Glen Luther, Q.C. will explore the principles arising from *R. v. Gladue*.

Shana Mohr (Training Coordinator, FASD Network) and Tanya Beauchamp (Support Program Manager, FASD Network) will start the day with an in-depth presentation on FASD, examining how the neurodevelopmental deficits associated with FASD present a fundamental challenge to the Canadian justice system. This session will provide insights into the many ethical considerations when representing clients who have a diminished capacity to foresee consequences, make reasoned choices or whose actions are likely to clash with assumptions about human behaviour at almost every stage of the justice system.

Glen Luther, Q.C. (Professor, College of Law, University of Saskatchewan) will present on the principles arising from s.718.2(e) and *R. v. Gladue*, and subsequent case law with an explanation of the Ipeelee restatement and clarification of Gladue principles. Current case law will be explained as a battle of Provincial Courts of Appeal. The issues of moral culpability and alternatives to incarceration will be reviewed along with the provision of Gladue reports and a discussion of proceeding in the absence of a report. The presentation will conclude with advice on how to ethically interview an Indigenous client.
