2019-20 Articling Year (commencing June 2019) –

North Battleford Public Prosecutions

The Saskatchewan Ministry of Justice is offering an additional articling position in 2019-20. You will be articulated to the Deputy Minister of Justice and based in North Battleford Public Prosecutions, where you will spend your time obtaining significant criminal law and litigation experience.

Public Prosecutions prosecutes those charged under the Criminal Code, Youth Criminal Justice Act, some other federal statutes, and some provincial statutes. Public Prosecutions promotes safe communities by just conclusion of criminal charges through various means, ranging from prosecution of trial matters to working with justice partners, individuals, and organizations to implement alternative resolutions.

Under the direction of the Regional Crown Prosecutor, you will hone your criminal law and litigation skills by independently managing summary conviction files, including case evaluation, docket court appearances, negotiations, and trials. You will have the opportunity to attend circuit court in Northern Saskatchewan and to work with experienced prosecutors on significant criminal files.

To round out your articling experience, you will spend time learning civil and family law with a private law firm or with the Legal Services Division of the Ministry of Justice.

The Ministry is currently accepting applications for this North Battleford Public Prosecutions position for the 2019-20 articling year. We are committed to achieving a representative workforce. A connection to Northern Saskatchewan and a desire to practice in the area after articles are considered assets.

The application deadline is Tuesday, August 6, 2018 at 10 a.m. Applications must be received by e-mail, mail, or fax on or before this date to be considered.

- your cover letter
- your resume;
- an unofficial transcript;
- contact information for three references;
- a four-page excerpt from one of your papers that demonstrates your writing skills; and
- your 1-2 paragraph idea on a criminal justice system innovation or improvement

The successful candidate shall be subject to a criminal record check as a condition of employment.
