b. Hearing Administrator Position

The *ad hoc* Recruitment Committee met on February 25th to refine the position requirements and the job posting. The job posting has been completed and was approved by the Committee. Much of our strategic focus has been diverted to responding to the events of the pandemic as has been reported to the Benchers on a weekly basis. In many ways, the steps we have taken in response to the pandemic have accelerated pre-existing strategic priorities. The pandemic has also provided us a lens through which to evaluate both our strategy and the steps we are taking to implement it.

Administration has begun the process of reviewing strategy considering the current circumstances. Administration is also in the process of considering the mechanics of facilitating Bencher discussion relating to strategic lessons learned.

ii. Annual General Meeting

On March 18, 2020, the membership was notified through *ReSource* that the AGM would be moved to a date in June.

The impact of the social distancing requirement posed by the pandemic makes it impossible to proceed with an in-person meeting. A decision was made at the last Executive meeting on March 18th that the AGM should be postponed until June. Administration is currently working on a proposal to carry out the AGM via electronic means.
