INTRODUCTION

- Some decisions require Council approval only while some require a Band decision;
- Key legislation is the *Indian Act* and the Indian Band Council Procedure Regulations; and
- Note that some communities (those governed by custom) have developed internal processes/policies that govern how decisions are to be made.















BAND COUNCIL DECISIONS - GENERALLY

• Section 2(3)(b) of the *Indian Act* provides that:

"A power conferred on a council of the Band shall be deemed not to be exercised unless it is exercised pursuant to the consent of a **majority of the councillors** of the Band present at a meeting of the council **duly convened**."

- Councils governed by the *Indian Act* can also use the Indian Band Council Procedure Regulations for decision-making processes; and
- Band Councils elected according to custom (not the *Indian Act*) are not bound to follow the Indian Band Council Procedure Regulations.



BAND COUNCIL DECISIONS - SUBJECT AREAS

- Possession of Lands in Reserves (s.20)
 - Here speaking of certificates of possession ("CP");
 and
 - Need consent of the Band Council before the Minister will grant a CP.
- Use of Reserve Lands by Non-Members (s.28(2))
 - Minister can grant a permit with the consent of the Band Council;
 - Usually one year in duration but can be longer;
 and
 - This would be akin to a licence.















BAND COUNCIL DECISIONS - SUBJECT AREAS

- Granting Authority to the Minister (s.57(a))
 - Used for cutting timber on reserve lands;
 - For unused/uncultivated reserve lands (s.58);
 - Disposal of non-metallic substances (s.58(4));
 - Reduce the amount owing to the Crown regarding designated/surrendered lands (s.58); and
 - Direct capital monies or directing revenue monies (s.64 and s.66(1)) respectively.
- Electing the Chief of the Band (s.74)
 - Band Council selects the Chief (not used in Saskatchewan)



BAND COUNCIL DECISIONS - SUBJECT AREAS





s.81 bylaws can be enacted but they require
 Ministerial approval within 40 days (unless it is disallowed within that time frame); and



s.83 are "money" bylaws or typically tax bylaws.
 The Minister must approve these types of bylaws before they are effective.









BAND COUNCIL DECISIONS - FORMALITIES

- Section 2(3)(b) requires "duly convened" meetings with "majority approval" by the Council:
 - No ability to have a resolution in writing;
 - Chief alone cannot make decisions;
 - Councillors can call it;
 - Notice must be given; and
 - A quorum of the Band Council must attend the meeting.
- Indian Band Council Procedure Regulations also provide guidance.



BAND DECISIONS - GENERAL

• Section 2(3)(a) provides that:

"a power conferred on a Band shall be deemed not to be exercised unless it is exercised pursuant to the consent of a **majority of the electors** of the Band."

 Other relevant legislation is the Indian Referendum Regulations.















Band List and Membership Codes (s.10)

- Must be approved by the majority of the electors of the Band;
 and
- Once the rules are established and approved the Band Council cannot amend it. The electorate of the Band as a whole must approve amendments.

Amalgamation with Other Bands (s.17)

Majority of electors must approve (rarely used).

Allege Trespass (s.31)

The AG can bring proceedings on behalf of the Band (rarely used)



Land Surrenders and Designations

- (s.38(1)) allows reserve lands to be <u>surrendered</u> absolutely to the Crown for sale. Not used now, except for land exchanges;
- An absolute majority must approve an absolute surrender;
- (s.38(2)) allows reserve lands to be <u>designated</u> for leasing purposes; and
- A simple majority must approve a designation for leasing (s.39(1)).















Control of reserve lands (s.60)

 Allows the Band to assume some control over lands from the Minister.

Electing Band Council (s.74(3))

 All electors age 18 plus can elect their Band Council. This is how most, if not all, Band Councils are elected.

Intoxicant Bylaw (s.85(1))

 Council does not have authority to enact such a bylaw. The electors must assent to the bylaw.



First Nations Land Management Act

 Requires more than 25% of all electors to approve the adoption of a Land Code and individual agreement.

Settling a Land Claim

 Indian Referendum Regulations governs approval of settlements by the electorate of the Band.

Approving Self-Government Arrangements

 The terms of the self-government agreement set out the threshold required to approve an agreement.


