Online Legal Information Portal: Answering Legal Questions Beta Site Launched

Those who attended SALI's 2021 Virtual Conference Series may recall learning about the Ministry of Justice's e-Justice Program project to create a provincial legal information portal.

Recently, the e-Justice Program launched [Answering Legal Questions](#) on the Government of Saskatchewan website. The site's goal is to provide the public with "one-stop legal information" on a multitude of legal topics. Information is currently provided for three areas of law in a "question and answer" style: [Bankruptcy](#), [Power of Attorney](#), & [Wills](#).

The resource has launched as a beta site to receive public feedback on the format of information and areas of law included and to determine the long-term direction for the project.

Bankruptcy

Bankruptcy is a process for when a person in debt can't afford to deal with their unsecured debt, such as a financial loan that is not secured by collateral.

Wills

A will covers the distribution of your estate after you die. A will can help ensure that your estate is divided the way you intended.

Power of Attorney

A power of attorney is not a person. It is a legal document that permits another person to manage your financial or personal affairs or both.
