Aboriginal and Indigenous Legal Information Resources

In recognition of June's [National Indigenous History Month](#) and [National Indigenous Peoples Day](#), SALI has compiled five resources containing Aboriginal and Indigenous legal information.

<p>Gladue Rights Research Database</p>	<p>The Gladue Rights Research database assists Indigenous people, lawyers, and judges with information that helps foster <i>Gladue</i> rights. It provides summaries and videos about settler colonialism, Indigenous community summaries, and other law resources.</p>
<p>Government of Saskatchewan</p>	<p>The Government of Saskatchewan website provides legal information for Indigenous Peoples at its First Nations, Métis and Northern Citizens page and Indigenous Law and Information Connection.</p>
<p>Indigenous Law Centre</p>	<p>The Indigenous Law Centre at the University of Saskatchewan provides programs, strategies and solutions to ensure the inclusion and recognition of Indigenous laws. Their books and publications are available through their website.</p>
<p>Law Resources List</p>	<p>SALI curates a Law Resources List for libraries, organizations, and individuals wishing to purchase online and print legal texts. The list includes a selection of Aboriginal and Indigenous law titles available for purchase.</p>
<p>Office of the Treaty Commissioner</p>	<p>The Office of the Treaty Commissioner works to ensure that the people of Saskatchewan understand treaties, the treaty relationship, and reconciliation by creating legal information and providing education sessions.</p>

Legal Assistance Options for Indigenous Persons

The [Aboriginal Courtworker Program](#) provides court navigation, information, and liaison services. They can help reduce delays, make restorative justice referrals, and suggest community-based services and supports.

The [Federation of Sovereign Indigenous Nations](#) provides legal information, assists with complaints about Government services, and helps with residential school claims.

The [Find Legal Assistance](#) tool provides a searchable directory of lawyers licensed to practice law in Saskatchewan. Users can search by name, organization, gender, location, language spoken, area of law, service model and payment model.

The [Indigenous Resources Officer Program](#) provides information, support, and referrals for Indigenous victims of crime.
