



NOTICE TO THE PROFESSION

2024 Continuing Professional Development Reporting Now Open

In December 2023, the Law Society provided a [Notice to the Profession](#) announcing changes to Continuing Professional Development (CPD) reporting beginning in 2024. The Law Society's CPD regulation is under review, with significant changes expected in 2025-2026.

While this review is ongoing, an initial change to discontinue the accreditation requirement for CPD activities has been implemented effective January 1, 2024. Members are no longer required to submit CPD activities for approval by the Law Society. Members must continue to complete and report (in their Member Profile) at least 12 CPD hours annually (including two that qualify as ethics hours). The criteria for activities to qualify for CPD hours remains unchanged (refer to the [CPD Policy](#)) and CPD compliance monitoring will continue.

The new CPD reporting process required changes to the reporting database which could only be implemented once all outstanding 2023 CPD reporting matters had been resolved. That work is complete and **members can now report 2024 CPD hours in their [Member Profile](#)**. Refer to these detailed [instructions](#) for assistance in reporting your CPD hours.
