Join this webinar to learn more about the nearly four-year Pilot that has led to formalization of limited licensing in Saskatchewan and the regulatory framework that will be in effect from January 1, 2026. 10/30/25	<p>Film Screening (Saskatoon)</p> <p>Legal Aid Saskatchewan is hosting its second annual #SKA2JWeek Movie Night as part of the province-wide dialogue on improving access to justice. Reconciliation and the implementation of the Truth and Reconciliation Calls to Action are a prerequisite for meaningful access to justice. Two short films will be screened and explore reconciliation as a foundation for meaningful access to justice. The first film, <i>Waniska - an Awakening of Indigenous Knowledge</i>, features a group of Elders out on the land as they address the importance of Indigenous knowledge and how this knowledge system may be called upon to assist humanity. This was filmed in Northern Saskatchewan and has a running time of 24 minutes. The second film, <i>Economic Reconciliation</i>, features Indigenous and non-Indigenous leaders sharing their insights and a hopeful glimpse at a respectful and prosperous future. The film has a running time of 23 minutes and demonstrates that reconciliation is key to economic certainty and prosperity in Canada.
