FORMAL COMPLAINT


I, Valerie Payne of the City of Regina, in the Province of Saskatchewan, Director of Professional Responsibility for the Law Society of Saskatchewan, do hereby certify that Greg Walen, K.C., Hearing Administrator, of the Law Society of Saskatchewan, has appointed a Hearing Committee pursuant to Rule 1118 comprised of Jaime Carlson, as Chair, Marg Romanow and Andrew Livingston to hear and determine a Formal Complaint set out by the Conduct Investigation Committee pursuant to Rule 1116, against **DEANNE KENDRA KASOKEO**, a lawyer and a Member of the Law Society of Saskatchewan, carrying on the practice of law at all of the relevant times in the Town of Cut Knife, in the Province of Saskatchewan, as follows:

THAT **DEANNE KENDRA KASOKEO**, of Cut Knife, in the Province of Saskatchewan, is guilty of conduct unbecoming a lawyer in that she:

1. did fail to hold in strict confidence all information concerning the business and affairs of the following clients:
 - M.B.
 - C.G.
2. did use or disclose a client's confidential information to the disadvantage of the client or for the benefit of herself without the consent of the following clients:
 - M.B.
 - C.G.
3. did, in relation to M.B., act in a conflict of interest by preferring her own interests over the interests of the client;
4. did enter into a financial arrangement wherein she borrowed funds from her client, M.B., without first ensuring that the client obtained independent legal advice regarding the transactions;

5. did accept gifts from her client, M.B., without first ensuring that the client obtained independent legal advice regarding the gifts;
6. did fail to be courteous, civil and act in good faith in her dealings with client M.B.;
7. did send correspondence or otherwise communicate with M.B. and a third party in a manner that is abusive, offensive or otherwise inconsistent with the proper tone of a professional communication from a lawyer, in relation to client M.B.;
8. did fail to act with integrity.
